പണിമുടക്ക് സമരത്തോട് ബന്ധപ്പെട്ട് ഗവൺമെൻറ്, അധ്യാപക സംഘട നകളുമായി അഞ്ചുതവണ ചർച്ചകഠം നടത്തുകയുണ്ടായി. സമരം ആരംഭിക്കുന്നതി ന്തുമ്പ് ജനുവരി 16നും ഫെബ്രുവരി 2നും, സമരം ആരംഭിച്ചശേഷം ഫെബ്രു വരി 11 നും 15 നും 28 നും ആയിരുന്നു ചർച്ചക≎ം. നമ്മുടെ ശക്തമായ സമരം ഗവൺമെൻറിൻെറ നിലപാടിൽ വരുത്തിയ മാററം മനസ്സിലാക്കാൻ ഈ ചർച്ചകളുടെ 'മിനിട്സ്' സഹായകമാകും. അവ, അതിൻെറ ക്രമമനുസരിച്ച് ജേർണലിൻെറ മധ്യഭാഗത്ത് പ്രത്യേക പേജുകളായി ചേർത്തിട്ടുണ്ട്. ഫെബ്രവരി 28 ലെ ചർച്ച സമരസമിതിയുമായിമാത്രമായിരുന്നു. ആ ചർച്ചയിലെ തീരുമാനങ്ങളാണ് പ്രത്യേക പേജുകളുടെ ഏററവും ഒടുവിലായി ചേർത്തിട്ടുള്ളത്.

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എ. കെ. പി. സി. ടി. എ യുടേയും എ. കെ. ജി. സി. ടി. യുടേയും സംയുക്ത നേ തൃതാത്തിൽ ഇരുപത്തിഅഞ്ചുദിവസം നീണ്ടു നിന്ന അതിശക്തമായ പണിമുടക്ക്സമരം കേരളത്തിലെ കോളേജധ്യാകരുടെ സംഘടിത <sub>ശക്</sub>തിയും സമരശേഷിയും വിളിച്ചറിയിയ് കുന്നതായിരുന്നു. 1971 ലെ ഡയറക്ട് പേമെൻറ് സമരത്തിനുശേഷം കോളേജധ്യാ പകരംഗത്തുണ്ടായ ഏറാവും വലിയ പണിമു ടക്കായിരുന്നു ഇത്. ഫെബ്രുവരി 4ന് സമ രം ആരംഭിച്ചപ്പോയത്തന്നെ മൊത്തമുള്ള ഏഴാ യിരം അധ്യാപകരിൽ 4493 പേർപണിമടക്കി. പിന്നീടുള്ള ഓരോ ദിവസത്തിലും പണിമു ടക്കിയവരുടെ എണ്ണം വർദ°ധിക്കുകയായിരു ന്നു. സംഘടനാഗം ഞടയം മാത്രമല്ല, നിഷ്പ ക്ഷൻമാരായി [നിന്നിരുന്നവരും പണിമുട ക്കിൽ പങ്കുചേർന്നു. വിമൻസ് കോളേജു കളിലേയ്ക്കും ട്രെയിനിംഗ് കോളേജുകളി ലേയ്ക്കും പണിമുടക്ക് വ്യാപിച്ചു. ചുരു ക്കത്തിൽ മൂന്നോനാലോ വനിതാകോളേജുക ളൊഴിച്ച് സംസ്ഥാനത്തെ മറൊല്ലാ കോളേ ജുകളും പണിമുടക്ക് മൂലം സ്തംഭിച്ചു. വ്യാപകവും ശക്തവുമായ ഈ സമരം ഗവ ൺമെൻറിൻെ മുൻനിലപാടുകയ തിരുത്തി കുറിക്കുകയും അധ്യാപക സമൂഹത്തിന് നേട്ടങളുണ്ടാക്കുകയും അഭിമാനകരമായ ചെയ്തു.

The Syndicate as its meeting held on 1-11-1980 considered the question of sanctioning half day's casual leave to the teaching staff in the affiliated colleges in the context of the introduction of shift system in colleges and resolved that the teachers in Affiliated Colleges who have work in both the sessions in Colleges where shift system has been introduced, be allowed half day's casual leave. Similarly teachers in colleges where there is no shift system and who work according to the old scheme (viz 10 to 4) will also be allowed half day's casual leave if they have work assigned in both sessions.

Orders are issued accordingly.

The study of physics as a branch of science should give the pupils a correct understanding of the natural phenomena connected with matter and different forms of energy and their transformations. It must also contribute to build up a systematic knowledge of modern physics by introducing topics which are related with every day life-It should be a general course which is suitable for joining any of the professianal courses. So stress should be more on practical applications than on theoretical derivations. It should further contribute to arouse their interest in science, to increase their curiosity and to develop their abilities to look for by generalisations arrived at through observations. experiments and theoretical discussions

Note: (1) This syllabus is written as a continuation of Kerala S. S. L. C. syllabus. The theory part of the syllabus may be covered in a course of lectures of about 180 hours. (First year-paper I. 90 hours; Second year - Paper II 90 hours). The course of laboratory work consists of about 35 experiments each requiring a session of two hours. The laboratory work would be distributed over both the years of the course.

- 3. The regular salary bills are not usually received in the zonal offices by the 20th of the month.

The representatives agreed to see that sufficient care is taken in the preparation of the bills and to submit it in time. It was decided that regular salary bills should be passed within five days of its receipt from Colleges-The bills will be taken up for scrutiny and countersignature strictly according to the date of receipt in the zonal offices. # MINUTES OF DISCUSSION HELD BY MINISTER (EDUCATION) AT 3.30 P.M. ON 16-1-1981 WITH COLLEGE TEACHERS ASSOCIATIONS

Various demands of the College Teachers were discussed and the following decisions were taken

#### 1. U. G. C. SCALES OF PAY

As desired by Minister (Education) the representatives of College Teachers Associations explained their view points and suggestions as to how the U. G. C. pay Scales can be implemented in this state. They stated that they were prepared to accept the higher qualifications prescribed by the U. G. C. for future recruits. They, however, agreed that the conditions regarding selection and appointment of teachers laid down by the U. G. C. would not be acceptable to private managements. Nevertheless, they demanded adoption of the U. G. C. Scales of pay.

### 2. UNIVERSITY (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1978.

The Associations were requested to put forward concrete suggestions as to how prompt discharge of the responsibilities of the teachers in respect of examination work could de ensured in case this provision in the University Act is deleted.

#### 3. NON-CADRE 1st GRADE PROFESSORSHIP

Minister (Eduction) explained that this cannot be treated as an isolated question applicable to teachers alone. This will have repercussions in the entire services.

4. COUNTING OF JUNIOR LECTURER SERVICE FOR PROMOTION AS II GRADE PROFESSOR (NON-CADRE)

It was pointed out that the question is under active consideration of Government and that final orders are expected to be issued shortly.

5 TOTAL SERVICE SHOULD BE THE BASIS OF PROMOTION AS PRINCIPAL IN GOVERNMENT COLLEGES

Minister (Education) suggested that instead of the existing system of Cadre Seniority for promotion as Principal, some credit should be given to

the total service for which purpose a minimum period of service as College Teacher has to be fixed. This will be processed accordingly.

# 6. NORMS FOR TRANSFER IN CORPORATE MANAGEMENTS

It was explained that this is under Consideration in consultation with

# 7. SANCTION OF EARNED LEAVE

It was decided that should be examined in detail.

#### 8. HALF DAY CASUAL LEAVE

It was decided that Government Collège Teachers who have to work in both the forenoon and afternoon shifts on the same day, may be made eligible for half day casual leave.

MINUTES OF DISCUSSION HELD BY MINISTER (EDUCATION) ON 2-2-1981

FORENOON WITH THE REPRESENTATIVES OF (i) THE ORGANISATIONS

OF COLLEGE TEACHERS AND (ii) FEDERATION OF

UNIVERSITY TEACHERS ASSOCIATIONS.

Minister (Education) recalled the discussions held with the Organisations on 16-1-'81 and pointed out that orders have since been issued in G.O. M.S. NO. 10/81/H. Edn. dated 28-1-'81, permitting to take into account the entire period of regular service as Junior Lecturer for purposes of calculating the 13 years of service required for non-cadre promotion as second grade professor. The representatives said that the term 'regular service', occurring in the said G.O., required to be clarified, so as to prevent any possible confusion, in the matter of interpretation in subordinate offices. It was decided that necessary clarification would be issued in this regard.

The Associations also requested that the benefit of the said G.O. dated 28-1-'81, be given effect to from 1-7-'79 instead of from 1-11-1980. This would be considered and orders issued shortly.

# (2) Total Service to be taken into account, for promotion as Principal-

It was suggested that a minimum period of 20 years of service as College Teacher might be fixed, as an additional essential qualification for promotion as Principal in the Colleges. Some of the representatives suggested that the feeder category for promotion as Principal need not (as at present) be restricted to the immediate lower category ie. the 1st Grade Professor It was considered that there is need to fix a minimum period of total service for promotion as Principal. The matter will be examined in details

### (3) Norms for the transfer of teachers under the Corporate Managements

The Organisations requested that section 64 of the University Actsomay be brought into force. Minister (Education) explained the difficulties in implementing this Section of the University Acts. Minister (Edu-) observed that he would convene a meeting with the Corporate Managements etcowith a view to formulating guide-lines/norms for inter-University transfer of teachers.

# (4) Implementation of University Grants Commission Scheme

Minister (Edn.) explained that besids scales of pay the U.G.C. Scheme involved specific conditions regarding minimum qualifications, method of recruitment, higher age of superannuation and higher, work load in the sense that no remuneration could be paid for examination and valuation work. The method of recruitment to all categories of posts; under the U.G.C. Scheme, was based purely on merit and this posed problem in this State where the rules regarding Communal Reservation had to be observed in appointments in Government Colleges, while in the matter of appointment to private Colleges, the Managements had the community quota.

The State Government had approached the Government of India a number of times in the Seventies, seeking changes (in view of the peculiar features obtaining in this State) in the U.G.C. Scheme, but those requests were turned down by the Government of India. Minister (Education) promised that the State Government would once again approach the Government of India/U.G.C. seeking changes in the Scheme, to suit the local conditions regarding communal reservation in Government Service, community quota for private College managements etc. Minister (Education) state that the State Government was prepared to consider implementation of the U.G.C. Scheme of pay scales with the proposed modifications in case, Government of India agreed to the implementation of the modified scheme in the State and also promised to extend financial assistance to the State to meet the additional expenditure involved. Simultaneously discussions will be held with the managements of private colleges, to find out whether they could be persuaded to fall in line with the U.G.C. norms.

# (5) The University Laws Amendment Act, 1978

Minister (Education) explained that Government are not particular about retaining as such, the existing provisions in Section 80 A. of the Kerala University Act; and Section 79. A of the Calicut University Act. There should be sanction of law for dealing with abstention from examination work or delays and other irregularities in valuation of answer papers. This aspect will have to be taken care of, before the existing provisions in the University Acts are repealed. Minister also stated that Government would formulate necessary proposals in this regard and forward the same to the Organisations of College Teachers, for their views / comments.

- (6) Conversion of the posts of Junior Lecturers into those of Lecturers
- It was decided to examine this question, in full detail.

(7) Concluding the discussions, Minister (Edn) appealed to the Teachers Organisations to withdraw from the proposed strike, especially since Government are now taking up again with the Central Government, the question of implementig the U.G.C. Scheme in this State.

CHIEF MINISTER WITH MINUTES OF THE DISCUSSION HELD BY THE REPRESENTATIVES OF COLLEGE TEACHERS ORGANISATIONS AT HALL OF THE 8 P. M. IN THE NEW CONFERENCE GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT ON 11-2-1981

Minister (Edn) explained the decision taken at the meeting held on 2-2-1981 with the representatives of College Teachers Organisations and rexpressed regret over the fact that inspite of the fact that Government had taken several positive decisions regarding the demands of College Teachers. they have chosen the path of direct action. The important demands of the College Teachers were then discussed.

- (i) U. G. C. Scheme:- After discussion it was announced on behalf of the Government that the Stae Government accept the U. G. C. Scheme in principle. But implementation of the scheme would be possible only if Government of India agrees to the following:-
  - (i) the retention of the principles of communal reservation in the matter of appointment to teaching posts in Government Colleges / Universities
  - (ii) continuance of the present provisions regarding appointment of teachers in private colleges,

(iii) financial assistance for implementation of the scheme from the Centre for five years. The State Government would be taking up the matter with the Government of India.

# (2) University (Amendment) Act 1978.

Minister (Education) stated that, as was made clear on earlier occasions, Government are not particular about retaining as such the existing provisions in the University Acts regarding forfeiture of salary for failure to do work connected with University rexaminations. These provisions will be repealed. At the some time provisions will be made to treat examination work as part of duty. 'There will also be sanction of law for dealing with default, delay or other irregularities connected with examination work. The norms to be laid down in this regard will be discussed with the represeintatives of teachers organisations

# (3) First Grade Professor (Non-Cadre)

The representatives of teachers organisations pointed out that promotion chances for college teachers are limited. It was decided that this question would be left open for further examination.

# (4) Abolition of Post of Junior Lecturer-

This has not yet been examined in detail. This will be examined in the context of the introduction of vocationalisation at the higher secondary stage in the Schools. The Universities will also be consulted in the matter-

(5) Anomalies in the existing pay scales of University Teachers.

It was decided to examine and rectify the anomalies, if any, in the existing pay scales of University Teachers

(6) Earned leave for vacation duty, in connection with examination work-

It was decided that orders now in force in this regard in the Department of Public Instruction in respect of School Teachers, will be made applicable to College Teachers also.

(7) Recent Judgment of the Kerala High Court regarding the scope of Section 57 (6) of the Calicut University Act

The Associations pointed out that the Kerala High Court has, in a recent Judgment, ruled that section 57 (6) of the Calicut University Act, as it stands at present does not confer any right of reappointment on teachers who were appointed in temporary vacancies and whose services stand terminated on the expiry of such temporary vacancies. As a result, the Managements are now at liberty to resort to fresh recruitment disregarding the claims of thrownout hands for re-appointment

It was stated that urgent action is being taken in the matter and that necessary steps to amend the Act will be taken immediately.

(8) Transfer of teacher from one private college to another-

also be holding a meeting with representatives of private college managements to discuss the matter.

Chief Minister concluded the discussion stating that the State Government have already taken several positive decisions and that other demands can be discussed further. He appealed to the College teachers to withdraw from strike and other direct action and to cooperate with the State Government

MINUTES OF DISCUSSION HELD BY MINISTER (EDUCATION) AT 10-30-A.M
ON 15-2-1981 IN HIS OFFICE IN THE GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT
WITH REPRESENTIVES OF COLLEGE TEACHERS / UNIVERSITY
TEACHERS ORGANISATIONS

- 1. Minister (Education) recalled the decisons taken at the meeting held by the Chief Minister on 11-2-1981 and stated that Government were expecting that the strike would be withdrawn in the light of the decisions taken.
- 2. Representatives of the College Teachers Organisations stated that there was no certainty that the Government of India would agree to the implementation of the U.G.C. Scheme with the modifications proposed by the State Government and with central assistance for five years. They wanted an assurance from the Government that in the event of nonimplementation of the U.C.C. Scheme in the modified form, their demands regarding abolition of the post of Junior Lecturer and creation of non-cadre lst Grade

professorship would be accepted by Government Minister (Education) stated that the approval of the Government of India for the implementation of the U. G. C. Scheme with modifications was being sought and that it might be premature to take decisions on the question of abolition of Junior Lecturership and creation of non-cadre 1st Grade Professorship at this stage. It was decided that in case Government of India did not agree to the U. G. C. Scheme with modifications within a period of six months the State Government would consider the question of non-cadre 1st Grade Professorship. The question of abolition of the post of Junior Lecturer would also be discussed and decided, in the context of introduction of vocationalisation in the schools at the higher secondary stage.

Representatives of Private College Teachers Organisations demanded enforcement of Section 64 of the University Act relating to inter-University transfer of college Teachers Minister (Education) explained the practical difficulties involved in the enforcement of these provisions and stated that as decided earlier, the matter would be further discussed with private College

managements.

4. Regarding the demand for counting of total length of service for promotion as Principal, Minister (Education) stated that this would require detailed examination. It was decided that for promotion as Principal from 1st Grade Profoessorship, the total service should be not less than 25 years.

5- As regards anomalies, if any, in the pay scales of University Teachers, Minister (Education) assured that these would be examined and

rectified within a period of six months-

- 6. Minister (Education) stated that a demand had been raised in another connection regarding certain additional benefits, viz family pension and gratuity; to private college teachers who have opted for Chapter III of the First Statutes in respect of Pension, Provident Fund, Gratuity, Insurance and Age of Retirement of Teachers of Private Colleges. Minister (Education) announced that family pension would be granted to dependents of such college teachers who die befor completing the age of 55 or after retirement. The rate of family pension would be based on the formula applicable to school teachers who have opted for chapter XIV B of the K-E-R. If gratuity is admissible to such school teachers, the benefit of gratuity will also be extended to the college teachers in question on the same basis.
- 7. It was pointed out on behalf of the Teachers Organisations that there were anomalies in the revision of pay scales of college teachers. It was contended that the parities that existed between the pay scales of colleges and those of certain categories in other Departments were upset as a result of the pay revision. The Organisations requested to take up specific case of anomalies with the Finance Dearpment.

8. Representatives of the college teachers organisations stated that benefit of increase in D A. admissible to Govt pensioners have not been extended to private college teachers. The frepresentative of the finance department pointedout that there increases in D A. have already been extended to private college teachers and clarifications, if any, required would be issued to the authorities concerned.

9 In conclusion, Minister (Education) appealed to the teachers to call off the strike, keeping in view the demands, already conceded by Government, so that further interruptions in studies may be avoided and the annual examinations, on which the career of tens of thousands of our students depend may be held without undue delay.

With reference to the demands raised by the organisations of College/ University teachers, I am to inform you that Government have taken decisions on these demands as indicated below:

#### U. G. C. SCHEME

State Government accept the U.G.C. Scheme in principle. But the implementation of the scheme would be possible only if Government of India agrees to the following:—

- 1) Retention of the principle of communal reservation in the matter of appointment to teaching posts in Government Colleges/Universities.
- 2) Continuance of the present provisions regarding appointment of teachers in private colleges; and
- 3) Financial assistance for implementation of the scheme from the Cantre for five years.

The State Government would be taking up the matter with the Government of India.

#### UNIVERSITY AMENDMENT ACT 1978

Government are not particular about retaining as such the existing provisions in the University Acts regarding forfeiture of salary for failure to do work connected with University examinations. Steps would be taken to repeal these provisions. Examination work will be treated as part of duty. There will be sanction of law for this purpose.

## FIRST GRADE PROFESSORSHIP (NON-CADRE)

In case the Government of India do not agree to the U. G.C. Scheme with modifications within a period of six months, the State Government would consider the question of sanctioning non-cadre First Grade Professorship.

COUNTING OF SERVICE AS JUNIOR LECTURER FOR PROMOTION AS SECOND GRADE (NON CADRE) PROFESSOR AND ABOLITION OF THE POST OF JUNIOR LECTURER.

It has already been ordered that for purposes of promotion of Lecturer in Arts and Science Colleges, as non-cadre professor Grade II, the entire

period of their regular service as demonstrator / tutor / Junior Lecturer will also be counted towards the qualifying period of 13 years (vide G. O. MS. 10/81/ H. Edn. dated 28-1-1981). The question of giving effect to the G.O. dated 28-1-1981 from 1-7-1979 will be considered and orders issued shortly. The question of abolition of the post of Junior Lecturer will be considered within a period of 6 months.

PROMOTION AS PRINCIPAL IN GOVERNMENT COLLEGES ON THE BASIS OF TOTAL SERVICE

It has been decided that for promotion as Principal from 1st Grade professorship, the total service should be not less than 25 years.

# NORMS FOR TRANSFERS IN CORPORATE MANAGEMENT

Discussions will be held with representatives of private College Managements and teachers organisations with a view to evolving norms. In case this effort fails, Government would examine the question of enforcement of Section 64 of the University Acts.

#### EARNED LEAVE FOR EXAMINATION WORK DURING VACATION

Orders now in force in this regard in the Department of public Instruction in respect of school teachers will be made applicable to College teachers also.

### ANOMALIES IN THE EXISTING PAY SCALES OF THE UNIVERSITY TEACHERS

Anomalies if any in the existing pay scales of the University teachers will be examined and rectified within a period of six months.

RECENT JUDGEMENT OF THE KERALA HIGH COURT REGARDING THE SCOPE OF SECTION 57 (6) OF THE CALICUT UNIVERSITY ACT

Urgent action is being taken to amend the relevant provisions of the University Acts.

PENSION AND GRATUITY TO PRIVATE COLLEGE TEACHERS COMING UNDER CHAPTER III OF THE FIRST STATUTES

Family pension would be granted to dependents of such College teachers who have opted to retire at the age of 60 and who die before completing the age of 55 or after retirement. The rate of Family pension would be based on the formula applicable to school teachers who have opted for chapter 14 B of K. E. R. If gratuity is applicable to such teachers, the benefit of gratuity will also be extended to the College teachers in question on the same basis.

zonal offices itself if possible. If the defects cannot be rectified in the zonal office, the bill may be returned to the concerned Principal for necessary corrections and resubmission as early as possible. Regular salary bills without defects should not be delayed on any account. The salary bills will be passed within three days after its receipt in the office of the Deputy Director.

### Supplementary Bills:-

The Accounts Officer, Office of the Deputy Director of Collegiate Education, Quilon stated that there are difficulties in passing supplementary bills along with the main bill as the required certificates cannot be given. The Deputy Director of Collegiate Education, Calicut has pointed out that in her office the supplementary bills are also being passed along with the main bills. The fact that the claim has been made in the supplementary bill will be noted in the main bill concerned and the supplementary bill copy will be attached with the main bill for audit purpose. It was decided that this procedure may be followed in the other zonal offices also and supplementary bills passed along with the main bill to avoid delay.

### Arrear Bills :-

The Deputy Directors pointed out that more time is required to check arrear claims. During the second half of the month the office will be busy with the main bills and the work on the arrear bills could be done only during the 1st half. Considering all aspects, it was decided that the arrear bills should not be delayed for more than two months from the date of receipt.

## Pending arrear bills:-

In respect of the pending arrear bills the Deputy Directors of Collegiate Education unanimously states that without strengthening their offices by providing additional staff, they cannot fix a time limit for clearing the pending arrear bills. Sri. Somanathan, Accounts Officer, Office of the Deputy Director of Collegiate Education, Quilon agreed that the pending arrear bills of N·S·S·College, Nilamel and Catholicate College, Pathanamthitta regarding the pay fixation will be passed before 10th of January 1981. The Director of Collegiate Education requested the Deputy Directors of Collegiate Education to furnish the number of pending arrear bills in their offices. The Deputy Directors of Collegiate Education promised to make an effort to clear the arrear claims relating to 1978 pay revision and fixation, before 31st of January 1981 as far as possible.

### Payment of vacation salary:-

Regarding the issue of settling of vacation salary claims it was decided to take it up separately. Director of Collegiate Education requested the representatives of the teachers organisations to furnish a detailed note in this matter.

# Payment of salary of teachers who come on Inter-University transfer :-

Pending approval of the Inter-University transfers by the University the salary claims of the teachers are at present admitted, for three months on the basis of the declaration furnished by them. It was decided organisations wanted the period to be extended to six months. It was decided to take up the matter with Government and to recommend the extension of period up to six months.

# Salary of teachers sent to M. Phil course under F. I. P.

The Association representative represented that pending approval of deputation by Government under Faculty Improvement Programme the salary claims of teachers may be admitted for a period of 6 months from the date of joining the course. It was decided to examine the question seperately.

# Delay in issuing approval of appointments / promotion :-

Representative of P. C. T. A. suggested that only one approval either by the University or by the Deputy Director of Collegiate Education need be insisted. The representative of the Teachers Forum said that double level checking should be avoided. It was decided that the matter may be taken up with Government.

The representative of A. K. P. C. T. A. pointed out that in the zonal office at Calicut, the approval of the Deputy Director of Collegiate Education is also insisted over and above the approval of the University before the salary claim of a person newly appointed is preferred by the College authorities

It was pointed out by the Deputy Director of Collegiate Education that the mere fact that a particular appointment has been approved by the University does not carry with it a direction to the Deputy Director of Collegiate Education to admit salary. The appointment is to be accepted for payment only on satisfying the conditions prescribed in the University Statutes. The zonal office has to exercise a check on the approvals made by the University to ensure that it is in accordance with statutory requirements.

After the discussions the Director of Collegiate Education informed that the matter will be examined and possible steps taken to avoid harships if any to the persons appointed

The Committee considered the Note presented by the Convener of the Standing Committee on certain general issues as well as simplification of the procedure now being followed in the matter of approval of appointments of teachers in the various Private Colleges item by item and recommended that the Registrar may prepare a comprehensive note on the items referred to in the note in consultation with Academic 'F' Section.

In the meanwhile, the following recommendations were made by the Committee:-

Item. No.1

Private Colleges - Fixation of strength of Teaching staff-Regarding

The Committee considered the question of simplification of the procedure relating to the granting of approvals for appointments and promotions of teachers in the various private colleges.

Recommended that the Principals to forward the asked may be proposals for staff fixation for a particular academic year sufficiently early, ie., before June of the year the fixation being based on the work November of the load as on 1st previous acacemic year and without waiting for the starting of new courses in the colleges which may involve fresh fixation and creation of new posts.

#### Item No. 2.

Private Colleges - Promotion to the posts of Grade II (Non-Cadre) Professor-regarding.

The Committee considered the question of approval of promotions of Lecturers as Grade II (Non-Cadre) Professors in Private Colleges in general and recommended that while considering the proposals for approval of such promotions (ie., of Grade II (Non-Cadre) professors):-

- Appointment / Promotion orders in Form I or Form c need not be insisted upon since the promotions are ordered on the basis of the G O dated 4-9-1973.
- 2. As regards those teachers who have been given exemption to hold the post of Lecturer (III Class Master's Degree) granting exemption from minimum qualifications need not be insisted upon

#### Item No. 3

Private Colleges-Promotion of teachers to the posts of Grade II (Cadre) Professors - Approval-regarding The Committee considered the question whether the present formality of asking the colleges to send request for obtaining prior sanction for the creation of posts of Grade II (Cadre) Professor in Colleges having Post-Graduate Departments and those in Language Departments can be dispensed with and recommended that the practice be dispensed with

Further recommended that the promotion (s) effected with effect from the date (s) of sanctioning of the new Degree course (s) or the date (s) of the order (s) promoting the teacher (s), whichever is later, be approved

#### Item No. 4

Private Colleges-Appointment of teachers-granting of approval-regarding.

The Committee considered the question of avoiding the delay caused in giving approval for the appointments made to various categories of teachers in private colleges and recommended the following:

First appointments, promotions etc., which are found to be in order in all respects should as far as possible be finalised and approved within two months from the date of receipt of the proposal in the University Office.

If the proposal is found to be defective, all the defects in it have to be noted at one time and not piece by piece at different times, and communicated to the Principal concerned to get the defects rectified.

#### Item No. 5

Private Colleges-Appointment of teachers - Staff fixation - regarding.

The committee also considered the question of avoiding the delay caused in the matter of fixing the staff strength in the various private colleges.

It was recommended that the fixation proposals which are in order should be finalised and disposed of within one month (at the most one and a half month) after the receipt of the same in the University Office. Defects if any, in them have to be noted, all fat one time and communicated for rectification within one month.

#### Item No. 6

Private colleges-Approval of Appointments of Teachers etc. strengthening of the Ac F Section regarding.

The Committee considered the question of strengtheing the Ac F section by providing adequate staff and posting the necessary - Supervisory staff in view of the increase in the work - load of the Section that has arisen consequent on the introduction of the shift system and the sanctioning of new courses at the Degree level

Recommended that appropriate action may be taken by the Syndicate in this regard.

In the case of those who remain in the pre-revison (1978) scales of pay, the amount of Dearness Allowance will be calculated as already ordered in the G.O. read as first paper above, the rates of Dearness Allowance admissible for increase in the cost of living index beyond 272 points, being replaced by the rates specified in the Annexure to this order.
- 3. These orders will apply to the full-time State Government employees, staff of Aided Schools, Private Colleges and Polytechnics, full-time employees, borne on contingency and work charged establishments and employees of local bodies, subject to the condition that the expenditure on this account in respect of local bodies, will be met from the funds of the respective local bodies.
